

We had an 82% retention rate in 2018/2019. All 11 staff members (as of December 2018) returned for the 2019/2020 school year.

School Year Enrollment (August - May)


We finished the school year with a total of 66 students.



Of our Tier 1 students, 6% received Colorado Preschool Program funding, 33% received Colorado Childcare Assistance Program funding, and 53% received additional scholarships.

Summer Enrollment (June and July)

57 students were enrolled, including 8 students that were registered to start for the 2019/2020 school year and were able to start early.



Of our Tier 1 students, 50% received Colorado Childcare Assistance Program funding.

Goals achieved this year:

- Based on feedback from staff and families as well as considering the financial impact and benefits to staff/family retention, year-round schooling and teacher-compensation was approved to be put into effect for the 2019/2020 school year.
- 2. We debuted our re-imagined fundraiser in May 2019: Hops and Hopes, a beer tasting and food pairing dinner at Ska Brewing. The fundraiser was a success, attended by 40 current families, alumni, and community members and raising \$2328. Thank you to the following businesses that financially supported Hops and Hopes: Ska Brewing, AVL Landscaping, and the Payroll Department.
- 3. Streamlined technology in order to save time and increase work place effectiveness including upgrades/addition of enhanced payroll systems, volunteer database for tracking/reporting hours, emergency contact notification, and redesigned website to accept online tuition payments.
- 4. Changed focus of Parents Supporting Students and Teachers (PSST)group to enhance community partnerships/collaborations and support teacher appreciation efforts.
- 5. Implemented curriculum that more closely aligns with Colorado Early Learning Guidelines https://earlylearningco.org/
- 6. Incorporated Conscious Discipline www.consciousdiscipline.com training webinars at staff meetings.
- 7. The following were maintenance projects completed:
 - Replaced toddler/garden gates and fence
 - Installed better locks for gates
 - Repainted hallways
 - Replaced heating/cooling system
 - Replaced siding on Red Room patio to prevent water damage to the exterior.
 - Installed key pad security system on front exterior door.

FINANCES (September 1st 2018 through August 31st 2019)
