Conscious Discipline Corner

Teachers use an assertive tone to teach children boundaries and to communicate clear expectations. The focus is on what we want the child to do instead of what they are doing wrong. Teachers provide them with a script of what to do or say differently in difficult social situations in order to teach them missing interpersonal skills.

Assertiveness

Assertiveness is the skill that emerges from the Power of Attention and teaches others how to treat us.

Instead of passively asking children, "Could you please be nice?" or aggressively yelling, "I told you to be nice!" we can assertively say, "When you want a toy, say 'May I have a turn?' and hold out your hand like this." Assertiveness says, "Your voice has power and I see you and hear you." It teaches others how to treat you with respect and how to set boundaries in a healthy way.
